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LEA Plan for Use Of Funds

1. The extent to which and how the funds will be used to implement prevention and mitigation strategies that are, to the greatest extent practicable, consistent with the most recent CDC guidance on reopening schools, in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning; ([count] of 2000 maximum characters used)

Soaring Heights will purchase additional COVID supplies such as but not limited to wipes, touchless sanitizers, touchless soap dispensers, and masks. In addition, a new gym floor will be purchased in order to withstand the proper sanitation chemicals and frequent cleaning as recommended by the CDC. Also, a new HVAC unit with ultraviolet light and MERS-13 filters will be purchased.

2. How the LEA will use the funds it reserves under section 2001(e)(1) of the ARP Act to address the academic impact of lost instructional time through the implementation of evidence-based interventions, such as summer learning or summer enrichment, extended day, comprehensive afterschool programs, or extended school year; ([count] of 2000 maximum characters used)

Soaring Heights will continue summer school for the struggling students to help bridge the learning loss as well as provide an Enrichment Program for the Gifted students for the 2022 and 2023 school year. Also, the school will provide homework help for all students in Kindergarten - 8th grade for the 2022 school year.

3. How the LEA will spend its remaining ARP ESSER funds consistent with section 2001(e)(2) of the ARP Act; and ([count] of 2000 maximum characters used)

The remaining funds will be used to provide STEM programs for students in grades Kindergarten - 8th grade. These programs will offer individual hands on activities to enhance the students science experiences. Additionally, the school will purchase additional laptop computers to order to insure each child has a personal device. To address the students' mental health needs, the school will purchase the program Mind Up for all students and staff.

4. How the LEA will ensure that the interventions it implements, including but not limited to the interventions implemented under section 2001(e)(1) of the ARP Act to address the academic impact of lost instructional time, will respond to the academic, social, emotional, and mental health needs of all students, and particularly those
