Board of Trustees Policy on Lateness

The Board of Trustees of Soaring Heights Charter School is committed to the principle that prompt arrival at school is an integral part of a child's education. Habits formed in childhood are frequently maintained throughout life. When a child recognizes that getting to school on time is very important to the parent, this value will then be transmitted to the child. Lateness is a disruption to other students and teachers as well as a loss of important instructional time. Soaring Heights Charter School expects its students to arrive in time for the official start of the school day which is 8:25 am. (Please read and sign the statement below.)

Lateness Policy

Any child who arrives late for school six (6) times during a single marking period shall receive a one-day out-of-school suspension. The child must return for a conference with his/her parent(s)/guardian(s) before being readmitted to school following the out-of-school suspension.

Textbooks: Health, Reading, Science, Social Studies, Math, Spelling, Language Arts and Spanish

Policy Prohibiting Threats of Violence

Students are prohibited from making remarks and/or gestures which threaten violence or which use the following or similar words: kill, die, murder, shoot, gun, knife, stab, blow-up and choke. Such remarks shall not be directed at a specific individual or a group of individuals while students attend Soaring Heights Charter School.

Should a remark and/or gesture threatening violence occur, the school will take firm action beginning with a thorough investigation. If the child making the threat is 10 years of age or over, the child's parents will be advised, and the police may be notified. In addition, the following action will be taken:

<u>First Offense</u>: The child will receive up to 5 days out of school suspension, and there will be a meeting with school authorities and the family. After administrative review, law enforcement authorities may be contacted. When necessary, the child will be referred to a local mental health agency to determine if there is a need for counseling.

<u>Second Offense</u>: The child will receive up to 10 days out of school suspension, and there will be a meeting with school authorities and the family. After administrative review, law enforcement authorities may be contacted. When necessary, the child will be referred to a local mental health agency to determine if there is a need for counseling.

Third Offense: The child will receive up to 10 days out of school suspension, and there will be a meeting with school authorities and the family. After administrative review, law enforcement authorities may be contacted. The child will be referred to a local mental health agency with the expectation that he/she will enter the therapeutic process.

If the child is under 10 years of age, the following action will be taken:

<u>First Offense</u>: The child will receive up to 2 days out of school suspension, and school authorities will meet with the parents.

<u>Second Offense</u>: The child will receive up to 5 days out of school suspension and may be referred to a local mental health agency to determine if there is a need for counseling.

<u>Third Offense</u>: The child will receive up to 10 days out of school suspension and law enforcement authorities may be contacted. The child will be referred to a local mental health agency with the expectation that he/she will enter the therapeutic process.

Sexual Harassment Policy

All out-of-school suspensions listed below require a parent/guardian conference before the child is permitted to return to school, and the following consequences will apply to verbal, written and/or physical acts of sexual harassment:

Policy for a child in grades K-1:

<u>First offense</u>: parent/guardian notified; one-half day in-school suspension <u>Second offense</u>: parent/guardian notified; 1 day out-of-school suspension <u>Third offense</u>: parent/guardian notified; up to 5 days out-of-school suspension

Policy for a child in grades 2-4:

<u>First offense</u>: parent/guardian notified; full day in-school suspension <u>Second offense</u>: parent/guardian notified; up to 3 days out-of-school suspension <u>Third offense</u>: parent/guardian notified; up to 5 days out-of-school suspension

Policy for a child in grades 5-8:

<u>First offense</u>: parent/guardian notified; up to 2 days out-of-school suspension <u>Second offense</u>: parent/guardian notified; up to 5 days out-of-school suspension. <u>Third offense</u>: parent/guardian notified; up to 10 days out-of-school suspension. An individual plan of action will be developed by the staff and parent/guardian suited to the particular offense. Law enforcement and mental health authorities may be contacted.

- Pants/Shorts/Skirts/Jumpers: khaki only
- · Collared Shirts: plain, white, light blue or navy.
- Sweaters: plain, solid, without hoods- white, light blue, khaki, or navy.
- · Skirts or shorts: no shorter than one inch above the knee.
- Long-sleeve undershirts must be a solid school color (white, light blue or navy).
- No leggings, jeggings, stretch fit, skinny fit, tight fit pants, denim jeans or skirts.
- No midriff shirts. If raising your hands above your head reveals your midriff, the shirt is not appropriate.
- No undergarments or shorts may be showing under your clothes.
- No undersized (tight) or oversized (baggy) clothing.
- · No flip-flops, sandals, open toe shoes, or slippers. Feet must be enclosed.
- No hats may be worn inside the building.

Gym Uniform To be worn **only** on gym days

- Sweatpants, sweatshirts and shorts must be only black without stripes or writing other than the school logo.

- No hooded sweatshirts, jerseys or oversized T-shirts.

- · Sneakers should have white soles or say "no skid marks" on the sole.
